Donbraid flock owner takes top honour at Killeter

AN outstanding ram lamb, presented by Newtownstewart breeder Ian Donald walked off with the top accolade at the recent show and sale organised by the NI Branch of the Suffolk Sheep Society at Killeter mart.

The exceptional lamb, a son of the highly-acclaimed Conveth Scotty, was selected the show champion by judge Robert Tait. The adjudicator wasn't the only one suitably impressed, later in the sale ring the best of show achieved the joint top price of 650 guineas.

That price was equalled only by the first prize-winning shearling belonging to Martin Harkin, another eye-catching sire bred by Glenhead Ghengis Khan.

The best of the rest saw Cookstown breeder Robin McAdoo sell four rams for 510, 440, 425 and 420 while Ardstraw's William Moore, Hunter Stewart, Castlederg and L and M Liggett, Drumquin all exceeded the 400-guinea barrier.

In the show ring, William Moore achieved second and third places in the shearling class behind Harkin's first prizewinner, while Donbraid flock owner Donald finished ahead of Willima Tait, Gary McAdoo and Gary Beacom in the ram lambclass.
